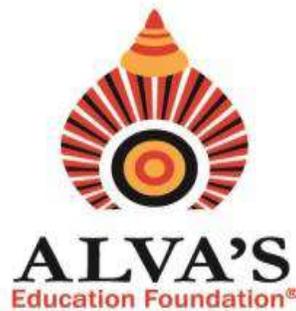

INCENTIVES TO THE CADETS BY THE CENTRAL GOVERNMENT

- A. **For 'C' Certificate Holders.** Specific vacancies in the Army, Air Force and Navy are allotted for NCC 'C' certificate holders. For officers there is **no UPSC written exams**. After application, the cadet is called directly for **SSB interview**, which he/she has to clear before final selection as per the merit list. The following vacancies are reserved by each service as officers :-
- a. **Army.** 64 seats per year at IMA & 100 seats per year at OTA.
 - b. **Navy.** 06 seats per course through Naval SSB.
 - c. **Air Force.** 10% vacancies in all courses through Air Force SSB.
- B. **5-10% bonus** marks for recruitment in ranks in Army, Navy and Air force.
- C. **Bonus marks** for employment in **CAPF/ Para Military Forces** and **Department of Telecommunication**.
- D. Can apply for gazetted post in CRPF if the cadet is a graduate.
- E. Preference in State Services and also in private sectors.
- F. Employment within NCC as Whole Time Lady Officer, Girl Cadet Instructor, Aero and Ship Modeling Instructor.

- G. In Air Force Academy 5% seats are reserved for Girls candidates holding NCC 'C' certificate.
- H. In OTA Chennai, seats are reserved for Girls candidates holding NCC 'C' certificate (Seats are notified every year).

NCC Annual Report 2020-21(Flt – B)

Air Wing NCC (Flt-B) at Alva's Engineering College is affiliated to No. 06 Kar Air Sqn NCC, Mangalore. Flt – B has an authorized strength of 100 cadets. Flt - B have enrolled total of 76 Senior Division Cadets and 30 Senior Wing Cadets. NCC training started from 21 Jul 2020 with online NCC classes due to COVID-19.

Classes Conducted:

1. From 21 Jul to 03 Sept 2020 online classes were conducted for 2ns & 3rd cadets.
2. From 17 Oct 2020 to 06 Feb 2021 Offline classes were conducted for 2nd & 3rd year cadets. The total of 54 classes were conducted.
3. The 1st year enrollment took place in the month of Dec 2020, from since then offline classes were conducted. Total of 26 classes were conducted.

The classes were conducted on Wednesday and Saturday as per the prescribed syllabus framed by National Cadet Corps accordingly Annual Training Plan (ATP) is prepared in coordination with 06 Kar Air Sqn NCC.

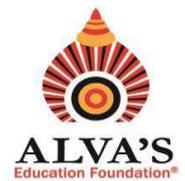

REPORT ON BLOOD DONATION CAMP CONDUCTED ON THE OCCASION OF NCC DAY 2020

FOREWORD

This report intends to brief about the involvement and support served by 06 KAR AIR SQN NCC, Flight – B, Alva's College, on blood donation camp conducted on the occasion of NCC at Muchur Grama panchayat. The 06 KAR AIR SQN NCC, Flight - B is headed by Flight Commander Fg Offr Parveez Shariff B G under the guidance of Commanding officer Gp Capt A G Srinivasan.

OUR COMMITMENT AND ACTION

The day started with understanding that a single donation can save three lives and one blood donation provides different blood components that can help up to three different people. Blood is needed every two seconds. Unfortunately, only 37% of the country's population is able to donate blood. An adequate amount of blood is needed in all healthcare facilities to meet the urgent need for patients facing trauma and other lifesaving procedures, such as blood transfusions which saves millions of lives each year. There is no risk for donors irrespective of the age factor. Blood donation process starts with registration followed by medical history, donation and then refreshment. Sterile needle is used for each donor. It takes less than 10-12 minutes. Less than one pint of blood is taken from the body. Our cadets were really enthusiastic to take part in the Blood Donation Camp and inspired many others to take part in it. We found the positive attitude of donors' desire to help a family or a friend in need to blood was the most cited motivation for Blood Donation Camp. Finally, if you're a blood donor, you're a hero to someone, who received your gracious gift of life.

The Blood donation camp was conducted by 06 KAR AIR SQN NCC, FLT-B, Alva's College in association with Lions Club and Munchur Grama panchayath and contacted the KMC Hospital to collect the blood and medical assistance. 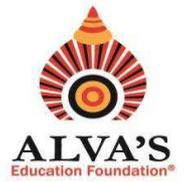

FOREWORD

Pragmatically, theory can be taught in a class room setting but in order to really test and train the theory in praxis, simulations are indispensable ways to give disaster responders a taste of the real disaster. Mock Exercise provides virtually the only means, short of an actual incident, of measuring the state of readiness and of testing the effectiveness of an emergency response Plan.

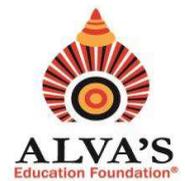

INTRODUCTION

India is vulnerable, in varying degrees, to a large number of disasters. More than 58.6% of the landmass is prone to earthquakes of moderate to very high intensity; over 40 million hectares (12%) of its land is prone to floods and river erosion; close to 5,700 kms, out of the 7,516 kms long coastline is prone to cyclones and tsunamis; 68% of its cultivable area is vulnerable to droughts; and, its hilly areas are at risk from landslides and avalanches. Moreover, India is also vulnerable to CBRN emergencies and other man-made disasters.

Disaster risks in India are further compounded by increasing vulnerabilities related to changing demographics and socio-economic conditions, unplanned urbanization, and development within high-risk zones, environmental degradation, climate change, geological hazards, epidemics and pandemics. Clearly, all these contribute to a situation where disasters seriously threaten India's economy, its population and sustainable development.

The Govt. of India has an efficient system for responding to both natural and man-made disasters through different Emergency Support Function Plan (ESFs). NDRF in the capacity of lead agency in the field of specialized disaster response is also committed to make India resilient towards disasters. India can be made a 'safe heaven' to live in by generating awareness and imparting training to the communities on disaster management issues at all levels by conducting regular Mock Drills. Mock Drill provides virtually the only means, short of an actual incident, of measuring the state of readiness and of testing the effectiveness of an emergency response plan.

OBJECTIVE

The broad objectives of the Mock Drill are as given below,

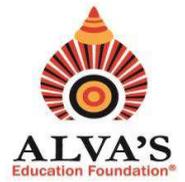
- To review disaster management plans.

CONDUCT OF MOCK DRILL

The District Magistrate of Udupi had conducted a Disaster Management Mock Drill on 05 Dec 2020 at Udupi on 0830 hours to 1030 hrs. In this activity, the NDRF team, Paramedical team, Mangalore Amateur Radio Club (MARC) HAM Communication team the Firefighting team and NCC Cadets had participated. This event was initiated by the NDRF folks. They've been asked to educate various regions in the country on how to handle emergency situations.

After being assembled at the required place and the formalities exchanged, the Mock Drill had started with the rescue operations to be done when a person is stranded and asking for help in the middle of a water body.

RESCUE OPERATIONS ON A WATER BODY

Emergency Management is a complex, collaborative network of agencies, levels of government, non-profit organizations, and volunteers coming together following a disaster. In addition to general plans and practices that can be applied to many emergency responses, some emergencies require more specialized training than the rest. Swift water rescue teams are assets that may be needed bow more than ever.

This Mock Drill started off with demonstrations on how a person can be saved amidst the water body by a rescue team on their boat. A boat can be used to travel some distance to the victim as well as serve as a platform to treat the victim following retrieval from the water. Numerous types of boats can be used by water – rescue teams when a victim is beyond the means of reaching via a rope or other device. Flat – bottomed boats (jon boats) and rigid – hulled boats are suitable, but the most common type of boat that's used by water – rescue professionals is an inflatable rescue boat because of its buoyancy and stable working platform. In case if the person is closer to the shore and there is no necessity of a boat, two types of rescue operations can be done, namely; contact and non – contact rescue.

- **Contact rescue:**

In this type of rescue operation, there is a physical contact between the rescuer and the person being rescued. These kinds of rescues can be done with a minimum of one member among

the rescue team. Even under this type, there were different ways one can be rescued from the water body which were demonstrated by NDRF.

- **Non – contact rescue:**

In this type of rescue operation, there is no physical contact between the rescuer and the person being rescued. There are several different techniques that can be used to reach somebody that is trapped amidst the water, including extending a pike pole, throwing an inflatable ring to the person or throwing a rope on to which the person can hold on and can be pulled to the shore.

HOMEMADE WATER RESCUE EQUIPMENTS

Apart from demonstrating their rescue procedures, NDRF also briefed everyone on how one can make their own water rescue equipment at home with little to null investment. Some of the homemade water rescue equipment are given below,

- Making a raft using bamboo sticks. One can add empty tins at each corners of the raft.
- Using thermocol sheets to make a vest.
- Using 8 - 10 empty closed bottles to make a belt.
- Using coconuts to make a belt.

The usage of all this remedy equipment was demonstrated by NDRF team. It was also encouraged that this equipment be made ready at home as soon as possible in order to prevent panic or distress at the last moment.

HAM RADIO

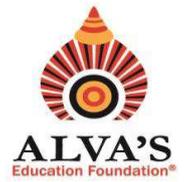
Management of any disaster or emergency event is a complicated and multi – faceted task. One of the most important, and oftentimes overlooked, parts of any highly efficient disaster response is effective information exchange between information sources, emergency managers and those impacted by the disaster or emergency event. The lack of communication can make responding to a disaster in a managerial capacity even more uncomfortable and stressful. The entire disaster management process is further complicated when hindered by ineffective information gathering and distribution.

Keeping in mind that communication is the main aspect or root of disaster management, NDRF commander was well aware of Ham Radio. He had also mentioned that Ham Radio was also included in their SOP documents. The amateurs of Ham Radio gave a brief demonstration on how to use the Ham station, it's fair advantage of not needing any network to function properly and providing the cadets a live chat session over the walkie talkie. The cadets were encouraged to join Ham and become a part of the amateur community.

CONCLUSION

Mock Drills have proved to be a useful tool to test the preparedness against any type of disaster. Correct methods of conducting mock drills will go a long way in improving the preparedness in the community against all types of perceived disasters. We cannot prevent hazards from happening, but can surely prevent them from becoming disasters and when they do happen, to minimize their effect in terms of loss of human lives and damage to infrastructure, by taking preventive and mitigation measures. Hence, NDRF might use this vital tool called 'Mock Drill' in training and educating the community and the Local Govt. to prepare them in dealing with the perceived disasters.

A total of 35 Cadets and 01 Flr Cdr of 06 KAR AIR SQN NCC, Flt – B, Alva's College took part in the Mock drill of Disaster Management and looking forward for more such activities to groom ourselves.

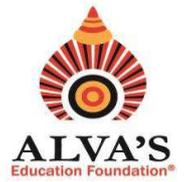

The cadets collected more than 20 bags of waste, which includes 3 categories

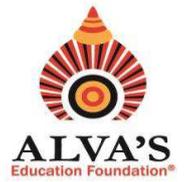

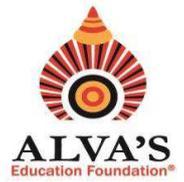

OUR COMMITMENT AND ACTION

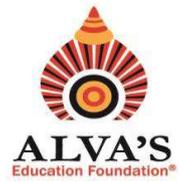

DISASTER MANAGEMENT TRAINING BY NDRF TEAM

Date: 11th January 2021 - 13th January 2021

TIMINGS: 9000 hrs. – 1700 hrs.

FOREWORD

This report intends to brief about the training imparted for NCC cadets by NDRF team conducted by 06 KAR AIR SQN NCC Flight B, AIET. A total of 250 cadets of Alva's College were present for this training program which includes the **Army Wing, Naval Wing, Air Wing**. This training was conducted mainly to educate and create awareness about to handle the situation during the disasters.

DAY-1:

The program was inaugurated by **Sri. Umanath Kotian**, MLA of Moodbidri & Mulky in presence of **Mr. Vivek Alva**, Managing Trustee, AEF, **Dr. Peter Fernandies**, Principal, AIET, **NDRF Team**, RRC Bangalore, **NCC Officers** of Alva's College and **NCC cadets**.



Session-1:

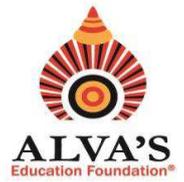
The Sub Inspector Praveen Kumar Upadhyia took up the session on the topic MFR (Medical First Responder). Medical First Responder is very important and crucial task required to be carried out at the spot of accident. If anyone is a trained in MFR he/she can take necessary steps at the spot before

ambulance arrives. Thus MFR tells us about the steps that are to be taken before taking the patient to the hospital when an incident takes place.

MFR (Medical First Responder):

1. He/she mainly does the dots check which is checking whether there is any fractures in the body.
2. Firstly a MFR should seek the permission from the bystander before doing the necessary checks, only if the permission is granted to MFR is supposed to proceed.
3. It is done by two persons where, one checks the victims and the other make a note of injuries in the victim, it is mainly for the reference of the doctor to start the treatment earliest as possible.

NDRF team gave demo on MFR and then asked some of the volunteers to perform MFR practically on the stage and after post lunch Fg Offr Parveez Shariff B G took interest and thought this was very important part of the training and split cadets in buddy pair then asked all to do the MFR training where cadets every practiced.

The second session was about bleeding control, soft tissue injury, and muscular skeletal injury. In this session, NDRF team demonstrated how to handle/control the bleeding of person at the time of accident.

1. Clean the wound surface with tincture and cover the wound with different types and ways of tying a bandage, as demonstrated by NDRF team.
2. If the bleeding doesn't stop then direct pressure need to be applied.
3. In case of skeletal injury, NDRF team had demonstrated with different types of bandage techniques with sticks and other props.



DAY-2:

Session – 1:

The session started with discussion on Foreign Body Airway Obstruction (FBAO). This session explained about the clearing the airway obstruction and providing oxygen if necessary at the time of incident.

There are 2 types of Choke: -

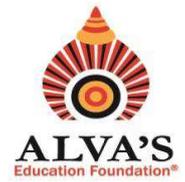
1. Partial Choke: This happens during eating food and during tongue twist.
2. Complete Choke: If this happens means person will not able to breathe and can die.

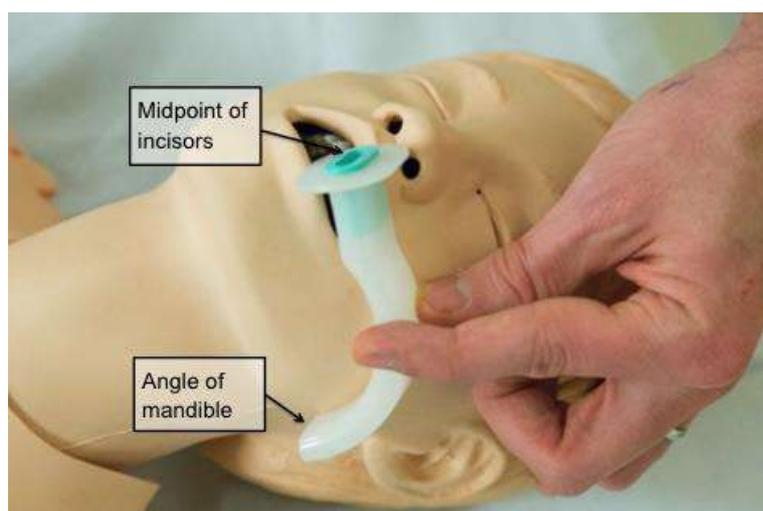

During this situation, the airway of the patient need to be cleared and provide the oxygen by one of the following methods.

1. Oropharyngeal airway,
2. Bag Valve Mask,
3. CPR mask usage.
4. Equipment's used in oxygen delivery system.

An **oropharyngeal airway** is a medical device called an *airway adjunct* used to maintain or open a patient's airway. It does this by preventing the tongue from covering the epiglottis, which could prevent the person from breathing. The correct size OPA is chosen by measuring from the first incisors to the angle of the jaw. The airway is then inserted into the person's mouth upside down. Once contact is made with the back of the throat, the airway is rotated 180 degrees, allowing for easy insertion, and assuring that the tongue is secured. An alternative method for insertion, the method that is recommended for OPA use in children and infants, involves holding the tongue forward with a tongue depressor and inserting the airway right side up. Use of an OPA does not remove the need for the recovery position and ongoing assessment of the airway and it does not prevent obstruction by liquids (blood, saliva, food, cerebrospinal fluid) or the closing of the glottis. It can, however, facilitate ventilation during CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and for persons with a large tongue.



The main risks of its use are:

1. If the person has a gag reflex, they may vomit.
2. When OPA is too large, it can close the glottis and thus close the airway.

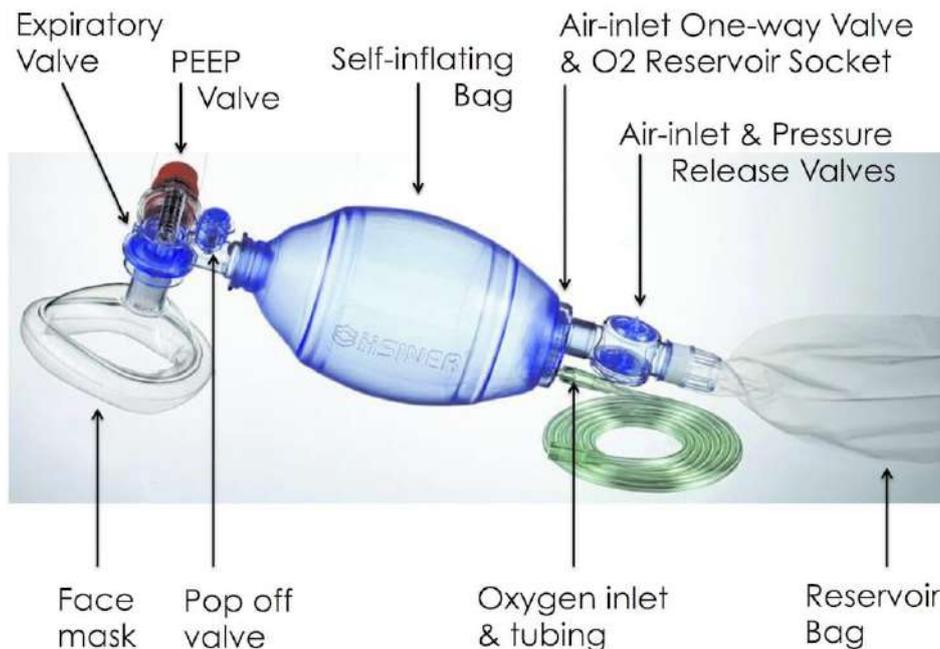

Bag Valve Mask:

The Bag-Valve-Mask (BVM) apparatus are also known as manual resuscitators and as self-inflating resuscitation systems. The examples include Laerdal, Ambu, Hsiner, Mayo, and Air Viva.



CRP Mask:

A **pocket mask**, or **pocket face mask** or **CPR mask**, is a device used to safely deliver rescue breaths during a cardiac arrest or respiratory arrest. The specific term "Pocket Mask" is the trademarked name for the product manufactured by Laerdal Medical AS. It is not to be confused with a bag valve mask (BVM).

Usage:

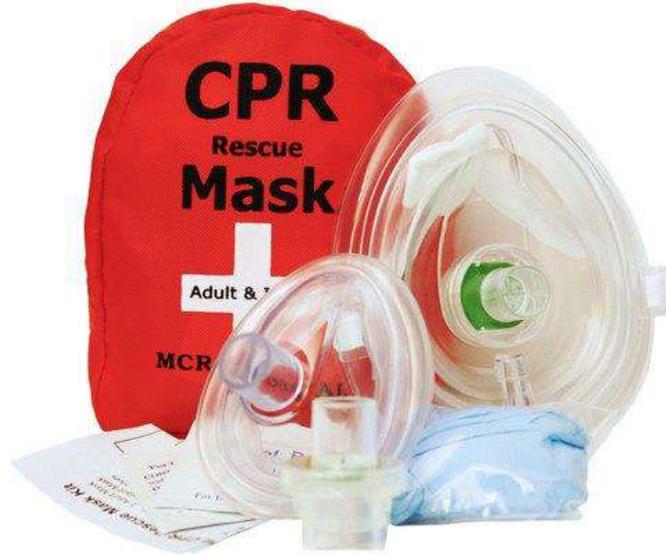
While a pocket mask is not as efficient as a bag valve mask, it does have its advantages when only one rescuer is available. As suggested by its name, the pocket mask benefits from a somewhat easier portability when compared to the bag valve mask. Also, in contrast to the bag valve mask, which requires two hands to operate (one to form a seal and the other to squeeze the bag), the pocket mask allows for both of the rescuer's hands to be on the patient's head. This hand placement provides a superior seal on the patient's face, and allows the responder to perform a jaw thrust on patients who may have a spinal injury.

Session – 2:

The session -2 was the demonstration of lifting and moving the patient. The following are the methods:

Lifting and moving: -

- Plan your move before lifting.
- Use your legs to lift, not your back.
- Keep the object close to your body.
- Stack move your body as vertical unit.
- Reduce the height from Kneeing down.

Moving Patients:

There are 2 types of patient moves, they are

- Emergency move.
- No -Emergency move.

Type of Emergency move:

1. Shirt drag.

2. Shoulder drag.
3. Blanket drag
4. Fire fighter drag

Session – 3:

The session -3 was on the flood management. The NDRF team had discussed the do's and don'ts to be carried out during flood. A **flood** is an overflow of water on normally dry ground. This is most commonly due to an overflowing river, a dam break, snowmelt, or heavy rainfall. Less commonly happening are tsunamis, storm surge. The deadliest flooding was in 1931 in China and killed between 2,000,000 and 4,000,000 people. The Kerala flood in India was another flood that has destroyed people's houses.

Causes of Flood:

Flooding is usually caused when a volume of water within a water body, such as a lake, overflows outside it. Sometimes if a dam breaks, it suddenly releases a large amount of water. The result is that some of the water travels to land, and 'floods' the area. Many rivers are in a channel, between river banks. They flood when the strength of the river causes it to flow beyond the banks. This is more common at bends or meanders. Flood damage can be prevented by moving away from places that flood. However, people have long liked to have their homes and businesses alongside water because water is good for agriculture and transport and in other ways.

Before the Flood:

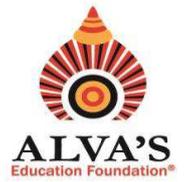
1. Stop leakage of Dams.
2. Evacuate the home you are staying.
3. Go to the high peak point areas.
4. Keep first aid kit with you always.
5. Use Floating things around you for your help.

During flood time:

- Switch off home currents.
- Close all doors of home.
- Leave freely to all animals if any tight at one place.

After Flood:

- Call medical Treatment or any forces nearby.
- Securely remove home doors and get in because there can be thing that can harm you.
- Don't move in any unknown flooded area.
- Dug and bury the dead animals in your surroundings.
- Search for clean water to drink.

Types of water:

1. Inland water: which is available in rivers, dams, pounds, wells ,etc.
2. Open water: which is found in Sea and Oceans.

Swimming Techniques:

The NDRF team had taught on different swimming styles and the easy way to swim for the non-swimmers.

1. Freestyle swimming:

Also known as the front crawl, this is the classic swimming posture. Lie on your stomach and flutter your legs while alternating the arms in a windmill motion.

2. **Backstroke swimming:** Lie on your back and flutter your legs while circling your arms in a windmill motion. It's very similar to the freestyle, but you swim on your back and propel yourself backwards.

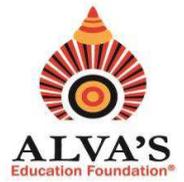
3. **Breaststroke swimming:** Float with your stomach facing down, then move your arms in a half-circle motion in front of the body. Bend your legs, then kick back with good timing, and you'll propel yourself up and forward.

4. **Sidestroke swimming:** Although not one of the official four strokes in competitive swimming, the sidestroke is a great survival technique. This is commonly used by lifeguards because you can hold onto another person and keep them above water while you swim.

KNOTS:

The NDRF team had taught the technique of tie knots, which will be helpful during the flood management to rescue/evacuate the people. This **list of knots** includes many alternative names for common knots and lashings. Knot names have evolved over time and there are many conflicting or confusing naming issues. The overhand knot, for example, is also known as the thumb knot. The figure-eight knot is also known as the savoy knot or the Flemish knot.

Different types of knots:

1. Tight interlacing of two ropes. A knot is also a unit of speed in aviation and marine navigation equal to one nautical mile per hour.
2. Halyard knot: interlacing of ropes used to attach the halyard to a sail.
3. Reef knot: interlacing of ropes made of two half-knots inverse to each other.
4. Bowline: interlacing of ropes with a loop that can be used as support.
5. Two round turns and a half-hitch: interlacing of ropes around an object by making two turns, then a Hal-knot.
6. Two half-hitches: interlacing of ropes around an object by making two half-knots, one after the other.
7. Double shell bend: double interlacing of ropes, used to attach two ropes together.
8. Sheet knot: interlacing of ropes used to attach two ropes together.
9. Figure of eight knot: interlacing of ropes used to finish the end of a rope.
10. Overhand knot: simple interlacing of a rope.

DAY-3:

It was the last day of the training and was field activity cadets were taken to Mulki backwaters, there NDRF team made three groups one was swimmers, second was non- swimmers and third was SW's who were supposed to learn boat handling. Constable Kanan was handling swimming trainings he has 17 years of experience in swimming and training so this was great opportunity for cadets to learn under him.

At first cadets were made to do exercises in water and on ground then made to enter in the water and made a line of 10 and there were total of 58 cadets in swimming group, Mr. Kannan thought four types of swimming techniques.

1. **Head up freestyle:**

Heads-up freestyle allows you to move around the pool quickly while keeping your face out of the water and have a look at the victim, and save him immediately.

2. **Head down freestyle:**

Head-down freestyle is used to move faster in water and save the victim in emergency.

3. **Breast stroke:**

Breaststroke is a swimming style in which the swimmer is on their chest and the torso does not rotate. It is the most popular recreational style due to the swimmer's head being out of the water a large portion of the time, and that it can be swum comfortably at slow speeds.

4. **Butterfly stroke:**

The butterfly (colloquially shortened to fly) is a swimming stroke swum on the chest, with both arms moving symmetrically. It is the newest swimming style swum in competition, first swum in 1933 and originating out of the breaststroke.

Ways of rescuing a victim who is drowning in water:

1. **By Chin Tow:**

Use this tow with cooperative or unconscious casualties. It is the easiest tow if you relax the towing arm. Your casualty should be towed behind you, not beside you which would be too much effort. Hold on to the chin, not the throat. Use side stroke or lifesaver's backstroke and don't kick the casualty.

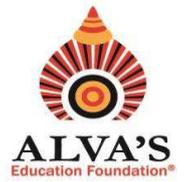
2. **By Head tow:**

This is another tow for a cooperative casualty. Holding the head gives good control and feels reassuring to the casualty. Only drawback is that you only have your legs to push forward with.

3. By Cloth Tow:

The clothes tow is used to help swimmers who are tired but not struggling. The rescuer grabs the clothes on the casualty's back between the shoulders and pulls him to a horizontal position, floating on his back. He maintains his hold of the casualty's clothes, keeping his arm fully extended, and uses a modified sidestroke while towing.

4. By Shoulder Tow:

This is yet another tow for a weak or non-swimmer who needs to be taken across deeper water. Ask the casualty to hold on to your shoulders or waist whilst you swim with normal breaststroke. Only use this tow with people who you can trust to behave and not to panic.

Overall, it was a great session to learn all this technique.

 **Landmark Decade on Ecosystem Restoration 2021-2030 declared on 1 March 2019 by the United Nations to accelerate the restoration of degraded ecosystems, is part of a longterm effort by the Global Landscapes Forum (GLF), its partners and charter members.**

 **Momentum grew for the idea of a decade dedicated to landscape restoration throughout 2018 at international events organized by GLF in Washington, Nairobi and Bonn, Germany, hosted by the World Bank and UN Environment.**

 **Initial concept for the U.N. decade emerged from the Bonn Challenge to restore 150 million hectares of land by 2020, and 350 million hectares by 2030, which was launched in 2011 by the government of Germany and the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), and later endorsed and extended by the New York Declaration on Forests at the 2014 U.N. Climate Summit. In its infancy, the concept of the U.N. Decade on Ecosystem Restoration was supported by El Salvador, UN Environment, IUCN and GLF.**

 **The decade, launched by UN Environment and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), weaves together a range of international agreements – including the U.N. Sustainable Development Goals, U.N. Convention on Biodiversity Aichi Targets, U.N. Framework Convention on Climate Change, U.N. Paris Agreement on climate change, U.N. Convention to Combat Desertification, Ramsar Convention on wetlands and the U.N. Strategic Plan on Forests 2017-2030.**

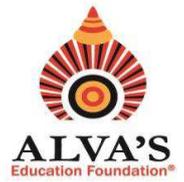
TIMELINE: ROAD TO U.N. DECADE ON ECOSYSTEM RESTORATION 2021-2030
