

REPORT:

The Inaugural talk by Rostrum-the speaker's club was presided by Padmashri Dr. A S Kiran Kumar, Ex-Chairman, Indian Space Research Organization along with Mr. Vivek Alva, Managing Trustee, Alva's Education Foundation, Dr. Peter Fernandes, Principal, AIET, Dr. Kurian, Alva's Degree College and Mr. Ranjan Bellarpady, Chief coordinator – Swacch Manas, Ramakrishna Mission, Mangalore

Introduction of the guest: Aluru Seelin Kiran Kumar (born 22 October 1952) is an Indian space scientist and former chairman of the Indian Space Research Organisation, having assumed office

on 14 January 2015. He is credited with the development of key scientific instruments aboard the Chandrayaan-1 and Mangalyaan space crafts. In 2014, he was awarded the Padma Shri, India's fourth highest civilian award, for his contributions to the fields of science and technology. Kiran Kumar previously served as Director of Ahmedabad Space Applications Centre.

Kiran Kumar Aluru Seelin was born in a hindu family in Hassan District in 1952, in the Indian state of Karnataka. He graduated in Physics (Honours). In 1971, from the National College of Bangalore University. This was followed by a degree of MSc in Electronics from the same university, in 1973. His further studies were at the Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore from where he passed MTech in Physical Engineering, in 1975.

Kiran Kumar started his career, joining Space Applications Centre, Ahmedabad, in 1975, working on *Space borne Electro -optical imaging instruments*. He has remained at the institution ever since and is the Director of the Electro-optical Systems Group since April 2012. He has represented Indian Space Research Organization at many international forums such as the World Meteorological Organisation and Indo-US Joint Working Group on Civil Space Cooperation and holds the Chair of the ISRO *Committee on Earth Observation Satellites* (CEO).

Event: Chairman of the Space Commission A.S. Kiran Kumar said the ISRO has been a champion in demonstrating the use of space technology for societal good. He was speaking after inaugurating the Speakers' Club, Rostrum, at Alva's Education Foundation in Moodbidri near here.

Space technology, as the powerful enabler, provides a variety of vital inputs for holistic and rapid development of the country. ISRO has launched many satellites since the space programme was set up in 1969 for various scientific and technological applications. It includes tele-fishery, mobile communications, broadcasting, meteorological observations, telemedicine, tele-education, disaster warning, search and rescue operations, he said. Dr. Kumar said: "Science and technology itself is neutral, but it is the person who decides whether it is used for good or bad. Taken for an example, atom power can be utilised for nuclear explosion or power plant. However, knowledge and skill you acquire needs a strong character to mould it for larger benefit of the society."

"At this point in time, we have to significantly enhance our capacity in our basic capabilities of observation, communication and navigation," he said. Technologies that would help in sending an Indian astronaut to space by 2022, as announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, would be another milestone in the history of ISRO, he said.

About 950 students from AIET and Alva's Degree College attended this talk on the topic "*India's Milestones in space technology*".

The guest talk at Rostrum-the speaker's club by **Dr. P Nagabhushan**, **Director**, **IIIT Allahabad** was hosted at AIET. The session had the presence of Mr. Vivek Alva, Managing Trustee, Alva's Education Foundation.

Introduction of the guest: Dr. P. Nagabhushan, Director, Indian Institute of Information Technology, Allahabad is Professor in Computer Science and Engineering, University of Mysore, Mysore. He has more than three and half decades of teaching experience. Prior to joining IIITA as Director, he has served several administrative positions such as Chief Nodal Officer, Choice Based Credit Pattern Continuous Assessment Education System, University of Mysore; Director, Planning, Monitoring and Evaluation Board; Dean, Faculty of Science and Technology; Director, Center for Information Science and Technology at University of Mysore, Mysore, India. He was also distinguished Professor and Chairman at Amrita Vishwavidyapeetam, Amrita University, Coimbatore; Director, Bangalore Educational Society for Technology Advancement and Research and Principal, Bangalore Technological Institute, Bangalore. He is actively associated with various academic, statutory and professional bodies.

He is the member of academic councils and Board of studies of several universities. He has been serving as an active member of Technical Advisory committee at Indian Statistical Institute, Kolkata, School Board member of the Central University of Hyderabad and Academic council member of Islamic University of Science and Technology, Awantipora, Jammu & Kashmir. He is also visiting Professor and acting as a subject expert in many Universities and Institutes. There are various high profile committees of AICTE, UGC, DST, PSC, NBA, ISRO, DRDO, RECs (now NITs) where Prof. Nagabhushan was an active member. Prof. Nagabhushan has worked as Investigator in several major funded projects. On the academic front, he has successfully guided 28 numbers of PhDs and has authored more than 500 numbers of Research Papers out of which more than 100 papers are DBLP indexed. The citation index of 1856 with H-index of 21 and i10 index of 53 reflects his academic accomplishments.

Event: Strong foundation, problem solving attitude and free expression is the hall mark of competent and capable engineer said, Dr P Nagbhushan, director, Indian Institute of Information Technology, Allahabad.

He said, "Our heart should echo with what we do, but not something which is compelled upon us. The whole process of learning should be pleasurable and meaningful to learner. Then only the core objective of learning would be served." Criticizing the process of preparing children, he said, "The process of preparing for something is foolishness, where as we should focuses on making our students learn comprehensively and act instantly on the gained knowledge."

Commenting on the present attitude of colleges behind the placing their students, he mentioned it has very unfortunate development, where learning is totally neglected. He said, "We should create an atmosphere where employer should come and ask for an employee rather than employee requesting for job with employer. However, the strong foundation, skill sets, creativity and confidence would accommodate candidate stand unique and make hirable anytime."

He said, "Engineering is creating that foundation which invisible repository of knowledge which shall be accessible instantaneously to solve a situation, at right point of time in right way. Once you gain this expertness, you would be in demand always. However, Alva's nurturing its students in same line and spirit."

Presiding over the function Alva's Education Foundation trustee Vivek Alva said that students should make use of the linkage between AIET and IIIT, Allahabad in their all spheres of learning.


and put Facebook's name on the front. The Sun logo reminds employees to stay motivated. It demonstrates what can happen when you're on top but fail to innovate."



Event: Ranjan addressed that the Mission came out with a pot composting initiative wherein wet waste generated in the household does not cross one's door and instead becomes rich manure. Mr. Bellarpady noted that a major problem with solid waste management would be addressed if the wet is properly handled

at source itself. Hence, the Mission is working extensively in popularizing the pot composting system and has plans in the coming days to buy dry waste too from households.

He said Swami Ekagamyananda, coordinator of the Mission's Swachh Mangaluru Abhiyan, has envisaged the pot composting and dry waste collection system on the premise that if waste generates money, people would participate in such a movement. At the same time, though people were keen on reducing wet waste generation or handling it properly, they had few avenues to do so; pot composting is a good option for them. ROSTRUM - The Speakers' Club in association with The Hindu Group organized a state-level debate competition in English for college students on March 24 th , 2018 at Alva's Vidyagiri Campus, Moodbidri. Nearly 200 teams from different parts of the State are participating in the competition.

Rules of the event: The competition is conducted in three stages, group discussion, turncoat, and the grand finale. The topic for group discussion will be given on the spot where groups of 10 members will discuss the topic. For the turncoat round, participants will chose a topic from the lot to speak for and against in three minutes. Best performing participants in the first two rounds will be selected for the grand finale.

Phases of the Debate Contest:

Round - 1: Group Discussion

Topic for GD will be given on the spot. Ten Participants will take part in group discussion for each round.

Round - 2: Turncoat

- Participants will hand-pick from the lot and speak on it.
- The duration will be restricted to 4 minutes.
- On the buzzer sound the participant is required to take the opposite stand on the topic.
- All participants must take part in round 1 and 2.

Debate Finale:

- The selection of participants for Debate Finale will be decided by panel of judges based on the performance in the round 1 and 2.
- Finale will be held on the same day at the same venue.

Structure of the Debate Finale:

- Maximum duration of the debate finale: 10 minutes.
- The selected participants for the Debate Finale speak *for or against* based on the topic based on token picked from the lots before the Debate Finale on the spot.

Duration	
4 minutes	Presentation of Views (Presentation of Views by both for and against participants on the topic.)
2 minutes	Cross question by participants (Questions and reply on the views by both for and against by participants on the topic.)
4 minutes	Cross question by the panel of Judges to the participants.

The topics for the Debate Finale are

Swachh Bharat Mission

Farm Loan Waiver

Minimum education qualification for people's representative

Is credibility of media at stake?

Corruption- a major issue in fourth coming lok sabha election

The participants are required to prepare in advance (for and against) for all the above topics for the Debate Finale.

At any stage, the decision of the organizers and the judges will be final.

Any offending statements presented by the participants on religion, gender, personal allegations and usage of offensive language during the contest will lead to disqualification of the participants.

EVENT:

Aliva Mishra from K.S. Hegde Medical College, Mangaluru, emerged winner of the 3rd edition of inter-collegiate zonal level English debating competition organised by *The Hindu* in association with Rostrum, the speakers club of Alva's College, in Moodbidri on Tuesday. Alvin Thomas from NMAMIT, Nitte, was the the runner's up while Samarth Gowda from AIT Chikkamagaluru stood third in the competition. A total of 10 debaters qualified for the final round of the competition.

As many as 62 students from different colleges from Dakshina Kannada and Udupi districts participated in the competition that commenced with group discussions of five teams each

simultaneously in three separate halls. The teams were given to discuss topics namely 'World does not need religion' and 'Does India need to spend more on education than defence'.

They spoke for or against one of five topics namely — Swachh Bharat Mission; farm loan waiver; minimum educational qualification for people's representatives; Is the credibility of media at stake; and corruption – a major issue in the forthcoming Lok Sabha elections.

Inaugurating the event, Mangalore University Registrar A.M. Khan lauded Alvas College for creating Rostrum that was providing a forum for youth to express their thoughts. In an era where youngsters are getting divided under influence of technology and other reasons, Rostrum brings youth together and this was a great achievement.



Introduction of the guest: From an agrarian family in Nitakal village, Malavalli taluk, Prathap, son of Marimadaiah and Savitha, is a BSc student at JSS College of Arts, Commerce and Science College, Mysuru. He has accredited as a 'Young Scientist' for his novel inventions.

The 22-year-old student has won the Albert Einstein Innovation Gold Medal in the International Drone Expo 2018 held at Hanover in Germany; and a gold medal in the International Drone expo held in Germany. He secured the first place in CeBIT Drone Expo-2018 at Hanover, Germany, and also bagged the gold medal in International Robotic Exhibition held at Tokyo, Japan, in December 2017.
