#### Field visit to "Sammilan Shetty's Butterfly Park"

Venue: <u>Belvai</u>, <u>DK</u>

Date: 22/09/24

**OBJECTIVES of Park:** To educate visitors, especially children, to highlight the need for conservation of butterflies. To provide a protected habitat for butterflies of Western Ghats biosphere and undertake scientific study and research on butterflies. Park provide an uplifting experience by viewing and enjoying the beauty of butterflies.

**DETAILS:** Sammilan Shetty's Butterfly Park was set up in the year 2011 by Sammilan Shetty, a young nature lover and butterfly enthusiast. The park is situated at Belvai, near Moodbidri at the foothills of the Western Ghats. The park is a treasure house of a wide variety of butterflies belonging to this region. This park is developed on natural greenery and the butterflies are also natural inhabitants of the park. The park respects the butterfly's freedom and no dome or enclosure is maintained to keep them trapped within the park. Only suitable conditions which are conducive to different varieties of butterflies are created to attract them to the park. The park is being run with service motive and is not a commercial undertaking.

Total 33 Members of SRISHTI-Club visited Sammilan Shetty's Butterfly Park on 22/09/24, along with faculty in charge Dr. Roshan Shetty. - Students collectively took an oath to work towards a pollution-free environment that supports and sustains the diversity of *Water Birds*.










